Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) and American Rescue Plan Act (ARP)

On December 27, 2020, and subsequently on March 11, 2021, two additional relief acts were signed into law: the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) of 2021. As part of CRSSAA and ARP, universities and colleges across the country were allocated funding through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). Purdue University Global has received and awarded its students monies through HEERF. The fund may cover any component of the student's cost of attendance at Purdue Global or to offset emergency costs that have arisen due to the coronavirus pandemic, such as costs for food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. If a student is deemed eligible, the student has received or will receive a notification from the university.
