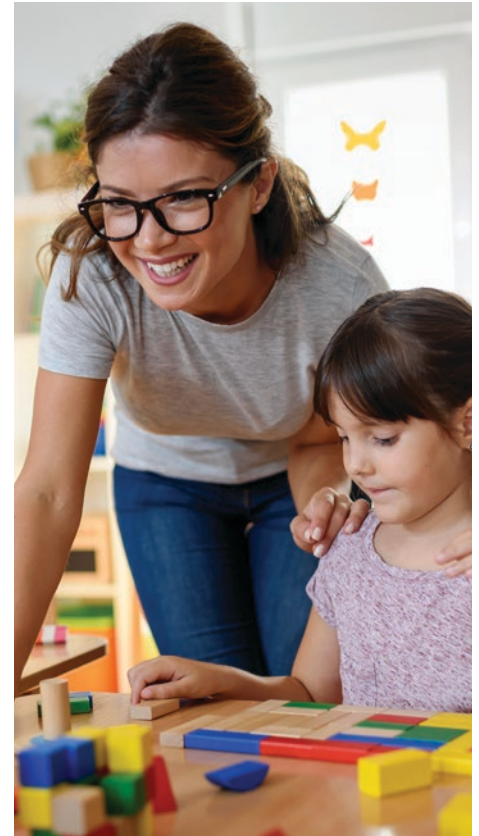

HAVE YOUR CDA? EARN TRANSFER CREDIT.

Students who hold a valid and current Child Development Associate (CDA) credential will earn 15 transfer credits for CE 101, CE114 and CE220.

Prepare for the CDA Credential

The course CE101: Introduction to Early Childhood Education meets the ten hours of training in each of the eight CDA Subject Areas that are required for the highly regarded Child Development Associate (CDA) credential. The eight areas include:

- Planning a safe and healthy learning environment
- Advancing children's physical and intellectual development
- Supporting children's social and emotional development
- Building productive relationships with families
- Managing an effective program operation
- Maintaining a commitment to professionalism
- Observing and recording children's behavior
- Understanding the principles of child development and learning

Many states require the CDA Credential for those who wish to take on the role of director of child development.

Students are responsible for understanding the requirements of optional certification exams. The University cannot guarantee students will be eligible to sit for or pass exams. In some cases, work experience, additional coursework beyond the Purdue Global program, fieldwork, and/or background checks may be necessary to be eligible to take or to successfully pass the exams.

Industry Outlook

- An associate's degree and experience in early childhood development are typically required to become a preschool teacher. Some college may be required to be a teacher assistant in a child care setting.¹
- About 4,600 openings for preschool teachers are projected each year, on average, over the decade.⁸ Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire.⁸
