PROGRAMS

Whether you are an experienced teacher or trainer currently working in a classroom, a new convert to the field of education, or somewhere in between, we meet you where you are and help you take that next step.

MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING

The Master of Arts in Teaching program is specifically designed for career changers. If you want to teach but your bachelor's degree or current job is in another field, our coursework prepares you to make the transition by providing a solid foundation in teaching methods for beginning teachers.⁵

We'll help build your knowledge, which will, in turn, build your confidence as you enter your new career. The curriculum focuses on the knowledge and skills relevant to secondary (grades 5–12) teachers and is based on nine program competencies that meet national and state professional standards.

IOWA CERTIFICATION TRACK

If you live in Iowa or in close enough proximity to complete weekly field experiences at an Iowa school, choose the certification track. This track is a blend of online coursework and onsite fieldwork and meets the educational requirements to obtain licensure as a teacher in Iowa. Students who successfully complete the Iowa certification track will be recommended to the Iowa Board of Educational Examiners for licensure; however, Purdue Global cannot guarantee a graduate will receive a teaching license. Purdue Global has not made a determination with respect to the licensure or certification requirements for any other states or occupations. The Iowa certification track of the Master of Arts in Teaching program is approved by the Iowa State Board of Education for the secondary teaching concentration area.

NONCERTIFICATION TRACK

This track is designed for students who live outside of Iowa. The program prepares career changers to teach diverse learners and become reflective decision-makers who promote student learning. Applicants must have never held a prekindergarten through 12th grade teaching license or been a Teacher of Record or classroom teacher. The program is not for existing teachers looking for an advanced teacher preparation track.

The program could help graduates become teachers in specific states in which we have established partnerships with state-approved alternative certification programs or via the Classroom Pathways Bundle. Please note that completing the Master of Arts in Teaching's noncertification track is not required to pursue a state alternative teacher certification program. Purdue Global cannot recommend students who complete the noncertification track for licensure.

Students residing in Iowa and Kentucky may not enroll in this program due to state department of education regulations.

Classroom Pathways Bundle

While Purdue Global cannot recommend candidates outside of the state of Iowa for licensure, we do offer a pathway to certification through the Master of Arts in Teaching Classroom Pathways Bundle. The American Board Certification of Teacher Excellence (American Board) is a nonprofit organization established by the U.S. Department of Education that offers a state-approved route to certification in Arizona, Arkansas, Florida, Idaho, Mississippi, Missouri, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, and Wisconsin. Upon acceptance into the Classroom Pathways Bundle Program, you will enter the Master of Arts in Teaching program and have access to the American Board Plus+ Program resources to help you prepare for the pedagogy and subject-area exams. American Board program resources and examination costs are included in the price of tuition for the Classroom Pathways Bundle; one less thing to think about on your path to becoming a certified teacher.⁷

Alternative Certification Programs

We also work with state-approved alternative certification programs, including the Education Career Alternatives Program (ECAP) in Texas.

BASIC REQUIREMENTS

ALL SCHOOL OF EDUCATION APPLICANTS

- You must have completed a bachelor's degree program at an accredited college or university with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average (CGPA) or higher.

MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING, IOWA CERTIFICATION TRACK

- You must submit a dispositions self-assessment.
- You must meet content-area requirements specified by the Iowa Board of Educational Examiners, including the completion of the minimum amount of semester hours in your chosen content area, and obtain a transcript analysis noting these requirements.
- You must provide proof of passing a criminal background check.
- You must provide proof of completion of a minimum of 10 hours of clinical experience in an Iowa secondary school
- Prior to enrollment, you must submit official passing scores on Core Academic Skills for Educators and Praxis II tests via the Educational Testing Service (ETS).

INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

- You will need to provide evidence of English language proficiency.
- You must have earned an equivalent, recognized baccalaureate degree. International transcripts submitted to the School of Education must be evaluated by one of the approved agencies listed by the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services on the following website: www.naces.org/members.htm. Official evaluated transcripts must be received by Purdue Global before you can enroll in a program.
