Industry Outlook

- Employment of emergency management directors is expected to grow from 2022 to 2032. The importance of preparing for and minimizing the risks from emergencies will help sustain demand, and vital positions in the industry are expected to be highly sought-after.⁷
- Employment in the disaster relief industry more than doubled between 1990 and 2017, with continued growth projected through 2026.8
- Employment in the protective service field as a whole is also projected to grow through 2031.⁷
- Many fire departments require a bachelor's degree for positions higher than battalion chief.⁷
