

Industry Outlook

- According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook for human services related occupations are projected to grow between 2% and 22%, depending on the area of focus.⁹
- Employment of social and community service managers is projected to grow 9% from 2022 to 2032, much faster than the average for all occupations.¹⁰
- Employment of home health and personal care aides is projected to grow 22% from 2022 to 2032, much faster than the average for all occupations.¹¹
