Bachelor of Science in Psychology in Addictions

If you have a passion for making a difference in the lives of those afflicted with addictions, earning a bachelor's degree in psychology may be the path for you. Psychology is the study of human thought, emotion, and behavior.

Many individuals in our communities face the serious psychological issues of an addictive personality. Substance abuse is often one of the unfortunate results. Addiction professionals are trained to assist these persons, and are committed to helping improve their quality of life.

Our Bachelor of Science in Psychology in Addictions is designed to equip you with a fundamental understanding of the major concepts, values, theories, psychological studies, research methods, and historical trends in psychology as they apply to addiction science, assessment, prevention, intervention, treatment, and case management.

The degree helps you acquire knowledge and skills that can make you a desirable candidate for a wide range of careers. It can serve as a strong foundation for pursuing an online Master of Science in Psychology at Purdue Global.²

You can gain management skills with an optional concentration in business foundations. The practicum track will allow you to incorporate a practicum experience in your program. The practicum track is required for residents of Indiana, Nebraska, or Wyoming.

This program is accredited by the National Addiction Studies Accreditation Commission (NASAC, NASACAccreditation.org). Purdue Global is a NAADAC Approved Education Provider, and the bachelor's degree program meets the coursework requirements to prepare students to take the optional National Certified Addiction Counselor, Level I and II certification examinations (NCAC I & II).⁷ The University cannot guarantee students will be eligible to sit for or pass exams. Refer to Purdue Global's State Licensure and Certifications page for state-specific requirements. Applicants will also need to complete

additional requirements to take the optional NCAC examination(s). Additionally, students who complete specific program requirements will earn a Peer Recovery Support Specialist Micro-credential, and if they meet the organization's additional requirements, they may be eligible to obtain the NCC AP National Certified Peer Recovery Support Specialist (NCPRSS) Certification. Bachelor of Science in Psychology in Applied Behavior Analysis

Have you ever asked yourself, "What can I do to help this person move on with their life successfully?" Purdue Global's online Bachelor of Science in Psychology in Applied Behavior Analysis degree might interest you.

Applied behavior analysis uses the individual understanding of people, how they learn, and what they need to devise successful behavioral interventions to help them succeed.

Master of Science in Psychology

Academic theory meets practical application in the Purdue Global master's degree in psychology. Our program teaches you how to apply psychological theories to real-world situations. You'll focus on the processes that underlie human behavior as well as the core knowledge, theories, and research techniques in the field. Prepare for careers in schools, hospitals, social service agencies, mental health centers, substance abuse treatment clinics, consulting firms, and private companies.⁴

The Master of Science in Psychology program with a concentration in addictions meets certain statespecific requirements and does not lead to licensure or certification as a psychologist, mental health counselor, or therapist.

It is important to note that, while earning a master's degree in psychology may qualify you to work in the helping professions, a doctorate degree is required to become a psychologist and a medical degree is required to become a psychiatrist.

As the program's culminating experience, you may choose to present a thesis or choose the Master's Capstone in Psychology track option. In addition, you can focus your degree around one of four concentrations and gain handson experience by choosing to complete a practicum.


Addictions: Explore the principles of counseling, group counseling, psychopharmacology, and co-occurring disorders, and how to guide patients toward recovery. A practicum experience provides hands-on experience in the field. This program is accredited by the National Addiction Studies Accreditation Commission (NASAC, NASACAccreditation.org). Purdue Global is a NAADAC Approved Education Provider, and the master's degree meets the coursework requirements to prepare students to take the optional National Certification Commission for Addiction Professionals' Master Addictions Counselor (MAC) examination.9 The University cannot guarantee students will be eligible to sit for or pass exams. Refer to Purdue Global's State Licensure and Certifications page for state-specific licensure requirements. Applicants must meet additional requirements to take the optional MAC examination, including degree, field experience, and licensure requirements. Refer to www.naadac.org/mac for full eligibility requirements.

Note: Indiana students are required to obtain 700 hours of university-sponsored practicum to seek state licensure as an addiction counselor.

General Psychology: Examine broad aspects of psychology including behavioral approaches such as neuropsychology, psychopathology, and cognitive psychology.


Forensic Psychology: Apply evidence-based psychological theories and concepts to develop strategies that advocate for populations in settings across the criminal and civil legal systems.

Industrial/Organizational Psychology: Explore the theories, methods, and practice of industrial/ organizational psychology. Study how to influence workplace motivation and attitude, employee training, evaluation and leadership, organizational behavior, and human resources. Practicum and nonpracticum versions of the concentration are available. The practicum is designed to provide you with hands-on, real-world experience within the field.


