

Omaha - Graduation Rates

A Graduation Rate calculation is based on a group of students who did not attend another college or university prior to attending Purdue University Global. These students enrolled from September 1, 2011 - August 31, 2012 and completed their program within 150% of the program's length. In addition, certain students are excluded from the rate above in accordance with National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) guidelines.

For example: A student enrolled in the 48 month Bachelor's Degree Program Graduated within 72 months.

- Federal grant recipients
- Subsidized federal loan recipients who did not receive federal grants
